Consuella's Journey

On August 9, 1976, an umbrella unfolded and Consuella Mia Belsches was born to Welton and Shirley Belsches. She was the only child born of this union. Consuella became a member of Hemingway Memorial AME Church and was baptized and nurtured under the leadership of the late pastor, Rev. Dr. William Robert Porter and the Hemingway church family. Upon Rev. Porter's retirement, Rev. Dr. Samuel E. Hayward served as her Pastor until 2018. While growing up at Hemingway, Consuella served faithfully as a Junior Steward, was an active member of the Children and Youth Choirs, the Sunday school, the Children and Junior Usher Boards, the Young Adult Usher Board and she also served as an Acolyte. In 2018 Consuella moved and attended Seaton Memorial AME Church, under the leadership of Rev. Ronald A. Boykin, who served as her pastor until her death.
